Basic School Regulation

23.3 A student who is at least 15 years of age on September 30 of the school year in which he or she begins training may enroll in the Work-Oriented Training Path if the student's last report card of the school year or IEP shows that (1) the training path, among all the training paths offered at the Secondary level, is most likely to meet the student's interests, needs and abilities; (2) the student meets the special requirements for admission to prework training set out in section 23.4 or to training leading to a semiskilled trade set out in section 23.5, as the case may be.

23.4 A student may be admitted to prework training if the student has not achieved the objectives of the elementary level programs of studies for language of instruction and mathematics. In the third year of prework training, a student may take the 375 hours of preparation for a semiskilled trade out of the prescribed time for the work skills program, if the student (1) successfully completed the work skills program in the second year of training; and (2) meets the special requirements established by the Minister for admission to the program leading to the semiskilled trade.

23.5 A student may be admitted to training for a semiskilled trade if the student has achieved the objectives of the elementary level programs of studies for language of instruction and mathematics but has not earned the credits in the first cycle of the secondary level in those subjects.
