



Goals for WOTP Mentoring: Communities of Practice

Moccasin Maker: 8791

 The trade is learned in a manner consistent with traditional First Nations ways of handing down knowledge.

 Seven compulsory competencies: communicate with the customer; make the pattern; choose the materials; cut the leather and the lining; bead or embroider the vamp or upper of the moccasin; assemble the sole and vamp of the moccasin; assemble the heel of the moccasin; and an eighth optional competency: finish the


moccasins.

Exterior Siding Cleaner: 8792

- Exterior Siding Cleaners generally work as part of a team.
 Candidates must be 16 years old in order to be issued a WHMIS card.
- Five compulsory competencies: prepare for the work day; provide customer service; ensure personal safety and site security; clean siding made of various materials (brick, stone, concrete, wood, metal, etc.); clean and tidy up the premises; and two optional competencies: operate a lift platform (training certificate required); and react in an emergency situation.
- Companies offering this service are plentiful across Quebec.
- Good employment prospects.

Bridge between Training for a Semiskilled Trade and Vocational Training

- Previously available on a temporary or "provisional" basis
- Now a permanent option for our students
- Available to TST students who pass Secondary Cycle I ELA, FSL & Mathematics AND receive a TST certificate
- The number of Vocational Training programs accessible through this bridge has been expanded.

Examples of Vocational Training programs recently added to the list of those available to successful TST students through this bridge:

- Landscape Operations
- Bread Making
- Northern Heavy Equipment Operations
- Assistance in Health Care Facilities
- Home Care Assistance
- Examples of those previously available include: Food and Beverage Services, Retail Butchery, Plastering, Tiling, Commercial & Residential Painting, Masonry: Bricklaying, and Production Equipment Operation.


