	Process	
	Role of teacher	Role of student(s)
Before	Students have been given the opportunity to identify and select appropriate resources for their current entrepreneurial project.	Students will have selected and recorded appropriate resources for their projects.
1	Discuss with students the importance of identifying and grouping resource needs.	Students will brainstorm why it is of value and organizationally helpful to group their resource needs.
2	Ask students, In their project groups, to review their list of resources to ensure that they are complete and up to date.	In their project groups, students will review their list of resources to ensure that they are complete and up to date.
3	Have project groups divide their necessary resources into four categories: financial, material, human and technical resources. Instruct students to identify each resource as F, M, H or T; or code and use four different coloured highlighters; or another appropriate method of identification. Remind them that they will have to work cooperatively to agree on the categorization of their resources.	In their project groups, students divide their resources into four: financial, material, human and technical resources. They select a strategy suggested by the teacher to identify each of their resources accordingly.
4	Hand out the <b>Resource Map</b> activity sheet to each student. Ask students, in their project groups, to organize their resources in the appropriate categories on the <b>Resource Map</b> .	Students, working in their project groups, will fill out their own <b>Resource Map</b> activity sheet. They will collaborate as a group to organize their resources in the appropriate categories: financial, material, human or technical.
5	Ask students, in their project groups, to review their choice of resources now that they have been categorized. Are any of the categories lacking resources? Can they envision any resources that might still be needed?	In their project groups, students review and assess their completed <b>Resource Maps.</b> They should determine if any resources are obviously missing. If so, they will decide who will do the research for additional resources.
Follow-up	Suggest that students revisit the <b>Resource Map</b> and make additions/subtractions as necessary throughout the project process.	Students can update their own <b>Resource Map</b> during the project. As well, they can use it as a reference/resource for future projects.
