# POP teacher shares student exploration initiatives

I have been a POP teacher and mentor for teachers across the province. I have had the pleasure of teaching POP for over 8 years, this experience has been very fulfilling for both my students and I. Years of teaching have made a huge impact on my classroom practices.

I encourage my students to explore careers outside of the classroom. This is accomplished by participating in a job-shadowing day in a career of their choice. Students in the past have job shadowed professionals in the following careers: Law enforcement, computer programming, neuroscience, engineering, veterinarians, and much, much more. Students come back to class excited about what they have learned and can't wait to share their experiences with classmates. They now have a better understanding on whether they might want to pursue this type of career.

Another career exploration initiative has my POP students planning their own career fair for grade 8, 9, and 10 students. The POP students carry out all the

tasks from planning the event, deciding on what companies to invite, accommodating employers and students on the day of the event, security and following up after. This initiative allows the students the opportunity to learn about all sorts of careers they may have wanted to explore in their future. Additionally, students develop and identify their personal qualities throughout this event. After the event students reflect on the impact of what they have learned with their own personal goals. Most of all students have fun as they learn about themselves.

I discovered that the students take ownership of their own career exploration initiatives. They are really committed and do the work required of them. With a little guidance and structure from me, I get to watch these initiates unfold. They never fail to surprise and amaze me. Who knew that POP would be so fun!

# EN Activity | Reflecting at the end - Evaluating

There are many EN activities available to you for your EN classroom. These activities are targeted, purposeful teaching and learning moments that build competency. The EN activity Reflecting at the end - Evaluating was developed for students who will use the Evaluating My Progress graphic organizer to be reflective and take steps to document their successes and failures as a means of improving any future entrepreneurial initiatives. #### WOTP | Bank of LES's

The Work-Oriented Training Pathway now has a bank of LES's specifically created by teachers for subjects within the Prework Training and Training for a Semiskilled Trade programs. With the endorsement of the Director Generals of the ten English school boards, the Directors of English Education Network (DEEN) have supported the development of this LES Resource Bank on the LEARN website. Specifically the DEEN subcommittee; CaReer Education and Transitions to Employment (CREATE), further facilitated the completion of these LES's. WOTP teachers created LES's that can be used in: Prework Training program subjects such as: English, Math, Autonomy and Social Participation, Geography, History and Citizenship, and Preparation for the Job Market, and Training for a Semiskilled Trade subjects such as: English, French and Math. The above table highlights the following: the title of the LES, which program and year it was designed for, and approximately how much time it may take.

To check them out, simply log in using your LEARN username and password and then click on the menu tab at the far left which reads, "DEEN LES Resource Bank".
